FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are the age requirements for campers?

Campers must be between the ages of 3 and 10 and be entering into or have just completed grades PK-5.

How do I register for a camp at IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch?

If a week of camp is full, is there a waiting list?

Yes, you may register for the waiting list once the week is full. You will be contacted via email and/or phone if an opening becomes available.

What is IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch's refund policy?

IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch does not provide cash refunds unless we cancel a camp with no alternative. However, we can provide on-campus credit under certain circumstances.

Can I register my child for a partial week?

We can only accept registrations for whole weeks. We do not offer discounted rates for missed days of camp.

Can my child's registration be transferred to another week?

Yes, when a week is transferred, please keep in mind that we will charge whatever the current rate is for that week of camp. For example, if you book a week at our "Early Bird Rate" in February and then call to transfer it to a different week in April, we will charge the difference to your account.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How can I cancel a registration?

Cancellations can be processed by calling, emailing, or visiting the front desk. Please remember that we make purchasing decisions, hire staff, and plan programming based on each child's registration. We will be unable to refund any monies for canceled registrations. In special circumstances, the Campus Director can provide a credit if the camp meets the guidelines. Please get in touch with us to explore what options are available to you.

Are there special requirements for children ages 3 and 4?

*Children enrolled in our early childhood program must meet additional admission requirements. On the first day of attendance, the following documents **MUST** be on file with IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch. The documents are valid for 1 year*

1. Immunization Record

2. Health Statement

What qualifications do staff at IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch have?

Our Program Director has eighteen years of experience working in educational early childhood and school-age programs with a Bachelor's in Elementary Education (EC-6 Grade). All staff must have at least 12 college credits and obtain eight professional development hours before being counted toward the classroom ratio.

All staff members are knowledgeable and experienced educators. All participate in a continuous program of in-service education and studies for professional advancement to remain alert to the ever-changing needs of today's families and the findings of current research.

All staff members must obtain 30 clock hours of training annually within their field, 1 of which is dedicated to awareness of child abuse and neglect and methods for increasing awareness of prevention techniques.

Every staff member undergoes an extensive background check that includes FBI fingerprints and state and federal clearances. In addition, every staff member has current CPR and First Aid Training.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What can my child expect at IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch Summer Camp?

Each child is grouped with kids of their age (early childhood, lower elementary, or upper elementary) and rotates through classroom assignments, creative projects, indoor games, etc. These activities are designed as much as possible to match the theme for the week. Lunch, snacks, small group times, and quiet time are scheduled each day for the same time slots. The planned activities vary daily, but some happen at similar times each week. Does IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch provide lunch?

IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch does not provide lunch; parents are responsible for providing lunch for their camper.

When should my camper arrive at IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch?

Campers not enrolled in pre-camp can enter the building at 8:25 a.m. Students enrolled in pre-camp will enter the building at 7:30 a.m.

What time should I pick up my camper?

Camp ends at 3:00 p.m. Students not enrolled in post-camp will need to check out by 3:10 p.m. to avoid additional charges. Post camp ends at 6 p.m.

Can my child ride home with someone other than their parents?

Yes, as part of the enrollment process, the enrolling parent will list all individuals who have authorization for IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch to release the child to. For your camper's security, those picking up your camper (including parents and legal guardians) must present a photo ID.

Does IDEA Lab Kids-Spring Branch administer medication?

The campus director must keep and administer all routine or as-needed prescription medications. At their discretion, the Campus Director will NOT administer any over-the-counter medications, vitamins/supplements, or essential oils your child brings. An Authorization for Administration of Medication form is required for any medicines. Please contact the Campus Director for specific questions.
